Leaves, leaves, leaves everywhere ...

As autumn seems to be speeding by, the leaves are now dropping continuously. While the grounds keepers do their best to keep the course tidy, it is something of a Sisyphean task. Please be aware of the applicable rules and etiquette:

- If you are marking a card or playing a match, and a ball heads into the trees, consider taking a
 provisional just in case. You are allowed three minutes to search, from the time you arrive in the area
 you think it has landed. This time can go very quickly and the balls can easily hide themselves under the
 leaves;
- Leaves piled by the ground staff for later removal are treated as ground under repair (see definition in rule book). If all players agree that a ball has entered such a pile, free relief is allowed under rule 16. It is not necessary to find the ball. Please be clear that this relief is not offered for leaves which have fallen to the ground or been blown together by the wind;
- 3. One of the most sensible amendments to the rule book a few years ago is that loose impediments, such as leaves, sticks and stones may now be removed freely from a bunker. This allows for any reasonable touching or movement of the sand (see rule 12.2a). This is a welcome change from the old situation when you just had to try to hit through a big pile of leaves! There is no penalty if your ball is accidentally moved in a search (Rule7.4) but you must recreate the lie.
