Hurlingham Cup

Our first interclub match of 2022 took place on 24th February for the Hurlingham Cup which was last played in 2019 having been cancelled the previous two years due to Covid. Interestingly, I noted when I reviewed the engravings on the cup that this event was first played in 1952. I am also told that it went missing for several years and was eventually found in the untidy boot of a Hurlingham Chairman's car. Anyway, I am pleased to report that Roehampton Club retained this trophy from 2019 with a 27-imp win.

Here is a report from Danny Gesua who was playing with Jeanette Reid about an interesting slam hand that gave us a 10-imp swing

The interest on this hand is in the bidding, not the play, although you do need to finesse the QH. If North bids 3H over 2S, 3NT might well be missed when this is the best contract. At our table, North bid 3NT over 2S. This is a sensible, practical bid which follows the Hamman maxim (Bob Hamman was world champion countless times): 'If 3NT is a reasonable option, bid it!'. Double is the other option which in this instance also finds the Heart fit but might make it more difficult to reach the slam.

After 3NT, I have no other bid forcing to slam than 4S (other than simply punting 6D or 6NT), but leaving it open

to which denomination. Jeanette interpreted my 4S as a cue bid insisting on Diamonds as trumps (a perfectly reasonable interpretation) and bid 5C. I then bid a pragmatic 6D. The finesse of the Heart Queen is not difficult to find, given the 2S overcall on my left.

Getting to 6D was fine at Teams but might well be a bottom at Pairs when 6H or 6NT would score better.
