EUROPEAN CLUB CHAMPIONS

ROEHAMPTON CLUB TRIUMPHS AT EUROPEAN SQUASH CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024: WOMEN'S TEAM SECURES THIRD CONSECUTIVE TITLE WHILE THE MEN'S TEAM TOPPLES THE PREVIOUS CHAMPIONS!



Roehampton Club men finally solved the Paderborn puzzle, becoming the men's European Squash Club Champions 2024. The large crowd, who had gathered to cheer for their home team, was wild throughout the game as they witnessed their heroes crack the German code. Roehampton Club will remember 7th September 2024, as a special day as both the men's and women's teams achieved championship wins with scores of 3-1 and 3-0.

The men's match on paper made Paderborn favourites and was a slugfest with the fast tempo set from the outset by Joe Lee vs Rowan Damming.

Roehampton Club entered the Nationals Clubs

for the first time back in 2013 and from 2014 Joe has been ever present in the team. He has had some great wins and performances, but none will match this final. A brutal first game saw Joe lose a close game to the younger Rowan, but this did not stop Joe sticking to his game plan taking the next game as Rowan's error count increased. Another very close third game went the way of Rowan and Joe was looking tired, but patience and experience was starting to tell as Rowan was also looking weary. A quick fourth game went Joe's way as it looked like Rowan decided halfway through to rest and push for victory in the fifth. Joe had other ideas and in a game that see-sawed with points and emotion the raucous crowd cheered Joe on and over the line to victory. What a start.

Team Captain and number one string, Adrian Waller, was up against Nicolas Muller – both world-ranked players showing their skills to the crowd. It was Paderborn's turn for victory in this string but not without Adrian getting what could have been an all-important game if the match strings ended tied.

One string all and Jonah Bryant (19 years old and world-ranked 68) faced Raphael Kandra (world-ranked 30). The first game Raphael was in control and using his experience to force errors from Jonah. The second saw a more measured game from Jonah to level the scores at 1-1. Raphael took control once more in the third, but Jonah was making him work for each point and trying to change the pace of play throughout the rallies. The fourth was a turning point as Jonah mixed cleaver use of the lob to push Raphael back the court and then take the



ball in short at the right times. The fifth game started normally but it was soon quick to see Raphael was mentally and physically broken but Jonah's speed and resilient retrieving to win point after point.

Roehampton Club now ahead 2-1 in strings but the game scores meant the deciding string match would confirm the winner. The fourth and final rubber between Simon Rösner vs Sam Osborne-Wylde once again had the crowd cheering and on the edge of their seats.

Simon on paper, albeit retired from Professional tour and former world number three, was favourite to win but Sam had other ideas. A close-fought first game was exactly what Sam needed as he saved game balls and ended up taking the game win and making Simon work very hard for each point. In the second Sam opened a lead and never looked back and the same happened in the third but Simon demonstrated his resilience against a younger, quicker Sam and saved four match balls, but it was not enough as Sam closed out the game and match 11/7 to take the title for Roehampton Club.







The women's team, on the other hand, was unbreakable for their neighbour, Surbiton (ENG). The triple winners have solidified their name as an elite force in ECC history.

25-year-old Jasmine Hutton, world number 21, said, 'I found the tournament really engaging and had a relatively smooth experience in the group stages. The only tricky part was finding our balance at the beginning, but once we got into the rhythm, things started to fall into place. We had the same team as last year, so getting ready was simple. We knew Surbiton would be our toughest competition, so we prepared a strong game plan, which we executed well.'

'The future of Roehampton Club squash looks bright ...'

Jasmine was able to secure an 11-8, 11-7, 11-8 victory over Surbiton's Kiera Marshall. 'Kiera has outstanding racket skills, but my steady pressure and shots were crucial to winning this match,' said Jasmine in her post-match interview.

'The future of Roehampton Club squash looks bright, and I feel lucky to be part of it. I believe our team needs to keep pushing forward and aim for more success. Our team's journey is far from over,' she added.



'So pleased with the teams' performance this week and to win the Women's ECC title three years in a row is a true testament to their commitment and team spirit at Roehampton Club. Surbiton are a great Club and certainly pushed us - wonderful for English Squash to have two teams in the final.'

way through the draw. Philipp having to give Alex a nine shot start with the handicap had to keep the error count low and concentration levels high. Alex, who moves well and is still improving, had to use the advantage to apply pressure on Philipp. A very fast start from Philipp, combined with good court movement saw him close Alex's lead and soon take the first game.

The second game saw Alex dig deep and scamper around the court getting most of Philipp's shots back. But Philipp had noticed if he kept the ball in the back left corner he had an advantage. He used this and kept his concentration to take the second game. Alex, cheered on by the crowd, continued to run for everything in the third game but was increasingly fatiguing and still getting caught out in the back left corner.

A great battle in the third game and again, Philipp kept his cool to win another close game and take the title.

A first Women's final for both players. A nervous Meg was up against Kace who on form was the favourite. Meg deserves



credit for her performance against a very talented player and Meg made Kace work hard for both the first and second games.

The efforts to do this also cost Meg as Kace used her impressive racket skills to move Meg around, keep her under constant pressure and break her resolve (and fitness) to see Kace win her fist title.

There were questions over Rudi's fitness, could he keep up with Bens fast pace play and movement? Or Ben's focus, can he keep calm when Rudi moves the ball around all four corners of the court?

The match did not fail to deliver, and it was Rudi who seemed to start the sharper of the two. World class shots and exquisite touch from both players saw them push hard from the outset. Rudi was more clinical though and after opening up a couple of points lead, he did not let it slip to take the first game. The crowd expecting a response from Ben sat back in amazement of the quality of the second game. It was Rudi who was putting on a show, fighting for each point and hitting sublime winners. Ben could not keep up and soon Rudi was 2-0 up with a fist pump to show the importance of taking the game.

Ben started the third game with less errors and more structured squash. After getting a healthy lead it was combined with some suggesting Rudi was having a little rest to rest for the fourth game. Ben was now back in the final. The fourth game had everything from silly errors, amazing shots and pure effort whilst outside the court you could feel the excitement, nerves and tension. Rudi raced ahead and Ben was looking like a beaten man, but he has matured and kept in each point after a poor start.

Slowly clawing back Rudi's lead, it looked to be in vain as Rudi served for the match at 10-9. Somehow Ben managed to retrieve every shot as Rudi put him under ever increasing pressure. Ben finally won the point to save match ball. His focus remained to close out the game and take the match to a fifth game.

As Ben has managed to stay calm and focused, Rudi had not faded from the extreme efforts of the previous four games. This was two gladiators with rackets and a ball surrounded by four walls giving it everything. This is where, as a spectator you feel bad knowing there has to be a winner and loser, but neither player gave any indication on who this could be in the early exchanges of the fifth game.

As the points continued it was Ben who seemed to just have that 1% more at crucial times and he managed to close out the game 11/8 to win a hard-fought title.

This gives Members a greater pool of 'friends or foe' to play against, and benefit those who play their games more regularly.



JAMES NEWELL



Traditionally played for in the following January, the battle for the James Newell Trophy 2023 title was fought in the first week of 2024, with 12 pairs competing.

The pairings provided competitive matches and close group results – even with an early morning start!


Congratulations to Pete Highmore and Nigel Clarke on their win and solid performances throughout the morning – remaining undefeated!

James Banks Newell was born on 25th September 1944. He joined Roehampton Club in 1966, aged 22 as a Restricted Full Member with an annual subscription of £8!

He won the Squash Men's Open title in his first season 1966 / 67, and went on to retain the title three years in a row.

Following his untimely death in 1979 aged 35, the Squash Committee agreed to set up a doubles competition in his memory.

This started in 1980 and continues to be played to this day.



SCHOOLSINVITATION

The final, Epsom vs Eton, saw the two most successful schools in the competition's history go head-to-head in an eagerly anticipated match. Roehampton Schools Squash Invitation has been held for 22 years and both Epsom and Eton have won five titles.

Epsom proved too strong in Group A, only losing one string in three matches, while Eton came through a very tough and competitive Group B ahead of Harrow by two points and Kings Canterbury by seven points respectively. Epsom were looking to retain the trophy for a third year in a row against a strong and ever improving Eton team.

The final score did not reflect some close games but Epsom again showed their strength in depth. With strings 2, 4 and 5 on first in the final, Epsom took an unassailable early 3-0 lead in matches meaning the title was theirs once more. Wins at 1 and 3 string sealed the victory for Epsom 5-0 overall. Congratulations to Epsom on winning the trophy.


DAY THREE
