The National Interclub Golf Croquet Cup Final was played at Cheltenham on 27th September. The summer had taken its toll on the lawns which, while quick, provided a challenge for both teams.

Roehampton Club won the doubles with Harry and Mark defeating Angharrad Watters and Jack Good 7-6. 7-5. In the opening singles, Nick lost to Nigel Matthews 6-7, 6-7, while Tim beat David Cornes 4-7, 7-2, 7-6. In the afternoon, the matches were all tightly contested with Jack Good just winning against Harry 4-7, 7-6, 5-7. Tim lost to Nigel in a close encounter 4-7, 6-7 and Mark beat Angharrad 7-5, 5-7, 7-4, leaving Nick as the last game on the lawn against David Cornes - it was even after two 7-6, 6-7, but Nick rose to the challenge to win the third game 7-2 and seal an overall 4-3 victory.





The European Club League GC Grand Final

The Grand Final of the 3rd European Club League took place at Sussex County Croquet Club (Southwick England) 10-12th October. The hosts were joined by 11 teams that had won their way through to the final from heats spread across Europe from Vigo in the West of Spain to Ikskile in Latvia.

The clubs were split into two blocks of six for the initial phase of the competition, with a match between the teams consisting of two doubles and four singles games.

Roehampton Club facing Phyllis Court (Henley), Broadwas (Worcester), Balgreen, (Scotland), CC Vigo (Spain) RC Nova Sancti Petri (Spain). The other block included Cheltenham, Sussex County, Carrickmines (Dublin) Ikskile (Latvia) and two Spanish teams including last year's winner.

Roehampton Club fielded a squad of six players and on Friday the team of Tim Russell, Diana Wilson, Dan Pearson and Nick Yates had an impressive start to the block games winning against Phyllis Court 5-1, and Broadwas 5-1, and drawing against Vigo 3-3. On Saturday the team changed to Tim Russell, Harry Fisher, Mark Van Loon and Nick Yates. They continued the winning ways beating Balgreen (Glasgow) 4-2, and Nova Sancti Petri 4-2.

We now faced defending champions Real Club de la Puerta de Hierro (Spain), in the quarterfinals, Roehampton Club without dropping a game won 7-0. In the semi-finals we came up against Phyllis Court who, captained by Chris Roberts, were determined to do better than in the block. However, we maintained our supremacy wining 6-1 leaving us to face Balgreen (Edinburgh) in the final.

Fittingly the sun came out and we set about the task in hand, wary of the competitive display they had put

up in the block. The final was played as the best of nine games – two doubles, one doubles and two singles and four singles.

Roehampton Club started well winning the first two doubles, 7-3, and 6-5 (on time). Continuing to apply pressure despite some competitive play, Roehampton Club kept ahead eventually running out winners by 7-1 with one game unplayed.

Congratulations to all. A great squad performance and just reward having finished runner up in the last two years. The best individual record over the course of the event, was Nick Yates (Roehampton Club) losing only his opening doubles game and ending with a record of 8/8 singles and 8/9 doubles. The competition is still growing and the number of teams entering, and quality of players competing is turning the league into a major event on the Club Croquet Calendar.

Report by David Openshaw: Two of our Members recently competed in Cairo in the 20th Egyptian Open GC Championship. Reg Bamford and David Openshaw have been regular competitors in this event, but neither have ever won it. Despite regular overseas competitors, Egyptian players have won on every occasion it has been played.

This year there were a record 88 players from 10 nations including several from each of Australia, USA and Spain. The block play was played in six different venues throughout Cairo. These clubs are multi sports clubs with one to three croquet lawns each.

David did not qualify for the 32 players knockout despite a good start. Reg won all his ten block games. In the first round of the knockout, he was drawn against the Egyptian international team member Khaled Kamal who he beat 7-3 5-7 7-4. In the next round he played the rapidly improving

Egyptian croquet is strongly based on interclub play with 17 clubs playing each other home and away during the season. Each match consists of a Men's singles, two Women's singles, a mixed doubles and a Men's doubles. Players only play in one of the matches, so each team consists of four men and four women. Of the 17 clubs 15 are in Cairo and two in Alexandria. Any Member interested in playing in Cairo as part of a holiday in Egypt can contact David for help to arrange this.
