



Ballot for the Tennis Committee Election 2025

Election of Committee Members 2025

Three candidates have been duly proposed for two vacancies. As the number of candidates exceeds the number of vacancies, a ballot will be required in accordance with the Articles of Association. The two vacancies will be filled by those candidates who obtain the largest number of shares voted in their favour. The results will be announced on Monday 3rd November at the Tennis Annual Meeting.

Voting Eligibility

To be eligible to vote you must be a Member of the Club (but not a Junior Member) and must be in a membership category that entitles you to play the respective sport for which you are voting.

When voting members should consider whether their level of participation in the sport warrants them voting in the election.

Members vote by placing their initials in the space provided opposite the name of the Member for whom they wish to vote. A MAXIMUM OF ONE VOTE MAY BE REGISTERED FOR A SINGLE CANDIDATE AND A MAXIMUM OF TWO VOTES MAY BE ALLOCATED OVERALL. **EXAMPLE BELOW**

I joined the Club only a few years ago, in 2022, and have ever since been trying to make up for time lost by not joining decades ago! Probably without exaggeration I am at the Club every day, either on court or in the Health Club, and always keen to meet new people across the variety of these touchpoints.

I play in all the leagues / boxes as well as the Club Championships and have recently entered ITF tournaments held at other clubs. The ITF matches would be quite a commitment for if you were to win each round - you'd be at that venue all week. In my case, I'm heading home after the first day but not despondent because it's fabulous to make new friends on court and to see other clubs.



Another great resource the Club has is membership of the Centenary Tennis Club (CTC). This has two opportunities for our Members. It provides access to other similar clubs around the world. I have used this many times to play at clubs in Hong Kong, Barcelona, Lisbon, Porto and The Hague which have all been very welcoming venues. Additionally, the CTC also run events for participating clubs.

My work life is as Programme Director for technology infrastructure in commercial buildings. My active project for the next few years is a new HQ for a large Asset Manager in Berkeley Square, which thankfully is not full time and gives me a great work / life / Club balance.

Since joining Roehampton Club four years ago, I have represented the first, second and third tennis teams across a range of competitions. The Club Championships are a highlight of my year — not only for the tennis, but also for the chance to meet and connect with other Members. Over the past two years, I have built strong links across the Club while leading the second team through successful seasons in the National Open League's top division.

Alongside tennis, I work as a macroeconomist in the Civil Service and am also a keen golfer and quizzer. My background includes four years on the committees of two of the UK's largest university tennis clubs — Stirling and Loughborough — where I served as vice-chair, chair, first-team captain, and treasurer. During my time as chair at Stirling, I negotiated a new court deal with Tennis Scotland, secured sponsorship from a local business, and led a major reorganisation of the club's coaching programme.

As a member of external organisations such as the International Club of Great Britain, I continue to compete abroad, keeping in touch with best practices at some of the world's leading clubs. Recent trips have taken me to Longwood in Boston, West Side in New York, and the AELTC.

If elected to the Tennis Committee, I will:

- Use my experience of leading other tennis clubs to help enhance the playing and social experience for all Members.
- Draw on my knowledge of competing at leading British and international clubs to advise on court surfaces and facilities that best serve our diverse playing community.
- Apply my professional expertise in data and cost-benefit analysis to produce evidence-based reports that support decision-making on facilities, including for emerging sports.
- Help strengthen pathways for Members to compete at junior, open, and senior levels, while also improving the tennis section's cohesion and the viewing experience for matches.



Anastasia Rentouli

I have been involved in tennis from a young age, first as a player and later in administration, governance, and coaching. Growing up in Athens, I was ranked No. 1 junior girl in Greece, represented the national team, and achieved an ITF junior ranking of 270.

My junior career earned me a full scholarship to Mississippi State University, where I competed as an NCAA Division I student-athlete. I later completed an MSc in Sport Management at the University of Stirling as a tennis scholar before moving to London and joining Roehampton Club.

At Roehampton Club, I have competed in the Ladies Team across the National Tennis League, National Premier League, Surrey League, and Mixed Doubles League, as well as in our annual Club Championships for the past four seasons.

Professionally, I work at the International Tennis Federation in the Major Events department, managing Davis Cup and Billie Jean King Cup events and contributing to planning for the LA28 Olympic Games. Previously, I worked in the wheelchair tennis tour across all four Grand Slams, World Championships, and the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games. These roles have given me a global perspective on the game and valuable insight into how clubs and players develop at every stage, across different abilities and backgrounds, from juniors to professionals to seniors.

If elected to the Tennis Committee, I would like to:

- Expand social tennis events and create more opportunities for Members of all ages and abilities to connect.
- Draw on my experience with world-class events to support facility standards and organisational excellence.
- Strengthen the junior pathway into adult tennis at the club.
