- A mix of warm-up bays, general practice bays, and dedicated coaching bays for structured lessons.
- Advanced TrackMan technology providing:
 - Long game practice facility
 - Virtual play on leading international courses, unlocking global inter-club competition.
 - Accurate, real-time swing and ball-flight data (club path, face angle, attack angle, launch, spin, speed, distance, strike location etc.).
 - o Enhanced coaching outcomes and faster improvement.
- A modernised short-game practice area that closely mirrors oncourse conditions and provides additional space for members to refine key scoring skills.
- A facility that adds variety and suits all levels—from beginners and juniors to advanced players managing swing changes or sharpening performance.

2. Year-Round Accessibility

The IGC provides consistent, uninterrupted access to practice and play:

- A weather-proof environment ensuring golf activity continues throughout the year.
- Extended operating hours beyond daylight limits, particularly valuable during winter months.
