

The final match had to go the 19th hole to decide the winners, and it was fitting that Scratch Team Captain Scott Stanley calmly rolled in a 6-footer to win the match for the Club. This is a tremendous result for the entire Scratch squad and the Club as a whole. The winning team in the final of Connor Hamilton, Henry Dubiel, Alex Tonge, Scott Stanly and Shaun Feldon were incredibly well supported and motivated in earlier rounds by Pete Crocombe, Finn Begley, Dave Birn, Vince Thorne and Mike Hamblin.



Equally as impressive was Jack Collins and Henry John's winning of the Kelso Hamilton final which is the first time the Club has won this 4BBB inter club Surrey competition since 2012. Jack and Henry were in the Surrey East Division and won 4 matches before beating Wimbledon Common in the East Division Final. This qualified them for the East v West final, which they won against Burhill GC, at Woodcote Park GC. This is a magnificent achievement by two of the younger members of the section. Great to see. Well done boys!

And finally many congratulations to Johnny Perkins and his Surrey 5s team/squad who won the Surrey East competition and just missed out in the County final, losing to Foxhills GC.
