

Ladies' Golf Captain's Blog – 18th December 2025



One of the real perks of being Ladies' Golf Captain is the opportunity to play with our brilliant professionals in the Captain and Pro series. It is also a wonderful way to raise funds for my charity, The Baked Bean Charity, that supports adults with learning difficulties, and I would like to thank all the challengers for their generosity.

In my first match, I had the pleasure of partnering Will, taking on the rather formidable combination of Cathy Staveley and Nicki Fillingham. I am sure Will won't mind me sharing that he has never managed to beat our Vice Captain, despite being well under par in their past three encounters. So, it was no surprise that he came charging out of the blocks with birdies on the first two holes (the 10th and 11th as we started on the 10th hole). Unfortunately, this only served to ignite our challenger's competitive spirit, with Cathy barely putting a foot wrong and Nicki playing out of her boots while also putting and chipping like a demon. Despite a scorching birdie two by Nicki on the 17th hole, the match remained in deadlock until Cathy produced a textbook par three, with a shot, on the 7th hole (playing as our 16th) to go one up.



As dusk began to fall on the final hole, it looked as though history was about to repeat itself for Will and me — one down with one to play. But matches are not decided until the final putt is holed and in a fittingly dramatic finale, Will stood over a twenty-foot downhill putt on the 9th green with the chance to square the match. The beautifully stroked putt tracked steadily towards the hole, slowing as it reached the cup. We all held our breath as it paused for a millisecond on the edge ... before tumbling in. A half — and one that felt every bit like a win. Incredible determination from Will, and huge thanks to Nicki and Cathy for a thrilling and thoroughly enjoyable match.

Next up, a week later, I partnered Alistair against Centenary Bowl players Charlotta Lyckeus and Kate Emanuel, and the match proved to be every bit as competitive. Starting once again on the 10th tee, we were unable to fully appreciate some of Alistair's enormous drives as he repeatedly launched the ball out of sight into the blinding autumn sun. The contest remained finely balanced all the way around until I managed to hole a twenty-footer to win the 2nd hole, which was followed up with a par four at the 3rd to take us two up.



However, with plenty of shots to be given over the closing stretch, there was no room for complacency. We knew this was little more than a vital buffer and that the match remained firmly on a knife edge. Sure enough, Charlotta made excellent use of her shot on the 6th, calmly sinking a nerve-wracking four-footer to win the hole. Kate then raised the pressure further by rolling in two eight-foot putts on the next two holes, leaving the match all square on the final tee — and crucially, with both Charlotta and Kate still receiving shots. In almost complete darkness and under immense pressure, Alistair showed tremendous competitive spirit, producing two superb shots to the 9th green to keep the match alive. Once again, everything came down to the final green and a dramatic putt-off: Alistair facing a three-footer and Kate standing over another

testing eight-footer. To our disbelief, Kate coolly drained her third consecutive eight-foot putt, leaving Alistair with an absolute nerve-jangler to secure the half. I should never have doubted him — or his trusty lab-tech putter — as the ball disappeared straight into the back of the hole. Another half rescued. Huge thanks to Alistair for holding his nerve, and to Charlotta and Kate for yet another outstanding and thoroughly enjoyable match.

Teams update
