It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Anthony Bagram, who was a much-loved Member of Roehampton Club for many years. Tony spent most evenings in the gym, kept himself exceptionally fit, was a black belt in Karate and practised yoga every day. His sudden death came as a great shock. Tony died in hospital last Saturday, 15th August, following complications after a recent hip replacement operation.

Tony was born in India and had a happy, though poor, childhood. His mother sent him to England to work for his aunt in her hotels before he trained as a hairdresser. Through hard work and determination, he became a highly regarded London hairdresser, working in some of the finest salons as well as privately. He even had the distinction of styling the Queen's hair on one occasion.

Many Members at Roehampton Club will remember Tony not only as a friend and fellow Member, but also as the person who transformed their appearances. He cut many heads of hair here over the years, but Tony didn't simply cut hair – he sculpted it. Tony's skill, independence and presence will be greatly missed.
